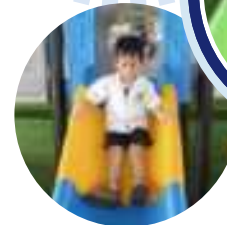


The 2024/2025 school year at TCIS has been transformative, with significant improvements across our campus. With the support of our school board, we've enhanced learning experiences for ECE and elementary students staying true to our commitment to their growth. /// ECE Facility Upgrades

New ECE Playground: This year, the ECE playground underwent a major transformation, thanks to generous donations from the Lions Club International. We replaced the old equipment with brand-new, high-quality slides and playhouses designed to inspire creativity and active play. Additional improvements included a new roof, ceiling fans, upgraded grass, and expanded play areas. In a gesture of generosity, the former playground was donated to Klongladkabang School, where it will continue to bring joy to more students.

ECE Classroom Remodel: With a significant investment from the TCIS Board, we redesigned and expanded the ECE classrooms, creating a sea-inspired learning environment that fosters creativity, exploration, and a sense of wonder for our youngest learners. In the spirit of collaboration, the classroom design process involved a partnership between the school board, parents, teachers, and the design team, turning our vision into reality.

/// Parent-Invited Events

Grade-Level Parent Events: To encourage greater parent involvement, this year we introduced Parent-Invited Grade-Level Events, expanding opportunities for parents to engage in their child's learning journey. Highlights included an Earth Day event for ECE and kindergarten, Diorama Day for grades 1 and 2, Egypt Day for grade 3, and Ice Cream Science Day for grade 4. These interactive events showcased students' learning while integrating artistic elements, making them both educational and visually engaging.



Sports-Themed Parent Events: For the first time, parents participated in Sports Day activities, including a lively Parents vs. Teachers Tug-of-War, which added a fun competitive energy. Parents also attended the exciting finals of the inaugural TCIS Grade 3 & 4 Intramural Football Championship, a mixed-grade event that fostered teamwork, skill development, and school enthusiasm. Our first ever Terry Fox Run was also a sports-themed highlight of the year.



/// Field Trips

Field Trips: Our field trips offer immersive, hands-on learning experiences that extend education beyond the classroom.



Thai Field Trips: Grades 1 and 2 visited Arun Farm Village in Chon Buri, while grades 3 and 4 explored Moori Moori Farm in Bangkok, where students learned about Thai culture and sustainability, reinforcing our Responsible Global Participant SLO.

Grade 1 and 2 Field Trips: The Grade 1 and 2 students also visited Sea Life, connecting their classroom studies to real-life marine life experiences. For many, this was their first chance to explore the ocean's wonders, sparking curiosity and a deeper understanding of marine ecosystems.

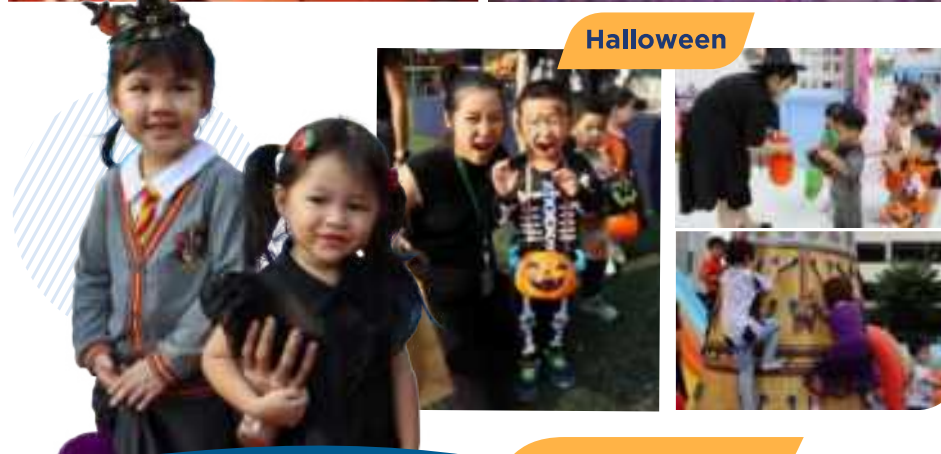

/// Curriculum

Our curriculum provides a strong foundation for ECE and elementary students, preparing them for middle school. From PK2 to grade 4, students become confident multilingual learners in English, Chinese, and Thai. ECE students build strong literacy skills through the Readers' and Writers' Workshop model, while our students consistently exceed expectations in math, showcasing their talents in contests like the International Math Genius Olympiad (IMGO).



MIDDLE SCHOOL

The 2024-2025 academic year at TCIS Middle School has been a remarkable journey of academic achievement, student engagement, and community involvement. From excelling in global competitions to celebrating cultural traditions and fostering leadership, our students have demonstrated dedication, resilience, and a passion for learning.



/// Academic Achievements

Our students excelled in competitions, earning a Bronze Award in the International Math Competition and multiple medals in the National Academic Test Program. At the World Scholar's Cup at Yale University, they won numerous medals, showcasing their academic prowess. Grade 7 students had their artwork selected for the 2024 International Youth Art Contest in San Francisco from over 1,000 global entries.

This year, we launched a Model United Nations (MUN) program for Grades 6-8, developing students' debate and public speaking skills. The Middle School Speech Contest further honed their communication abilities. Our commitment to academic excellence was celebrated during the National Honor Society (NHS) and National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) Induction Ceremonies.



Our science curriculum now integrates more academic reading and writing, while hands-on experiments and an expanded Science Fair foster innovation. Robotics students in Grades 7 and 8 held showcases, demonstrating their coding and engineering skills.





/// Cultural & Leadership Programs

A successful Chinese cultural exchange with a visiting Taiwanese school enriched students' cultural understanding. Thai cultural celebrations, including Songkran, featured traditional dress, performances, and activities. Week Without Walls provided immersive learning experiences: Grades 7-8 engaged in outdoor education in Chiang Mai, Grades 5-6 participated in team-building at Pattana Sports Resort, and on-campus students explored real-world problem-solving through Project-Based Learning (PBL).

To support personal growth, we introduced an Enhanced Advisory & Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) Program, equipping students with essential life skills. The Middle School Student Council spearheaded initiatives like Middle School Sports Day, fostering teamwork and school spirit.

/// Community Service & Celebrations

Our community united for the Terry Fox Fundraiser, raising over 250,000 Thai Baht—double our initial goal—to support cancer research. Chinese New Year celebrations included performances, art projects, and cultural activities. Throughout the year, we honored diverse traditions with events like Thanksgiving, Double Ten Day, Halloween, and Christmas, enriching our students' cultural appreciation.

/// Sports Excellence

Middle school athletics thrived this year. The Ping-Pong Team made a strong impact in regional competitions. Volleyball and soccer teams demonstrated impressive teamwork, securing victories against rival schools. The highlight of the year was the Junior Varsity Boys Basketball Team clinching the League Championship, showcasing their dedication and skill.

HIGH SCHOOL



The 2024-25 school year has been another action-packed experience for all of us at TCIS. There is never a dull moment in high school, as many activities and clubs happen throughout the school year. This year's activities have included all the usual favorites, such as the Halloween Festival, Loy Krathong, the Chinese New Year Celebration, Spirit Week, and Sports Day. We also sent students on new Week Without Walls adventures with trips to Cambodia and Korea.

Week Without Walls

The grade 9 and 10 students visited Angkor Wat, a UNESCO World Heritage Site considered the 8th Wonder of the World. They also went ziplining in the forest and were entertained by a circus. In addition, TCIS students learned to make rice noodles and curry in a traditional manner and served them to a local Cambodian kindergarten for lunch.

Our grade 11 and 12 students visited a variety of cultural sites in Korea, including Gyeongbokgung Palace. They even made Kimchi as a donation for local communities, earning recognition from a Korean newspaper. These experiences broaden students' perspectives while fostering leadership and teamwork.



National Honor Society

The National Honor Society and National Art Honor Society are essential programs that recognize students' academic achievements and creative talents. These programs are internationally recognized and provide a platform for students to develop leadership skills, participate in community service activities, and foster a sense of responsibility towards their peers and society.



Academic Excellence and Competitions

TCIS students continue to excel in academic competitions. Our Robotics Team excelled in VEX competitions, and two ninth-graders qualified for the World Scholar's Cup Tournament of Champions at Yale, winning multiple medals. Our students earned Best Delegate and Honorable Mention awards at Model United Nations (MUN) conferences. Beyond academics, the TCIS JV Boys Basketball Team won the AISAA League Championship, and students showcased musical talents in the Battle of the Bands.



Advanced Placement (AP) Program and IB Candidacy

TCIS offers diverse academic programs, including Advanced Placement (AP) courses and the Capstone Diploma Program. We are also pursuing International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) candidacy, further strengthening opportunities for students to earn multiple diplomas.



Planning for the Future

In high school, we continued with our dedication towards supporting students and their families with planning beyond TCIS by structuring academic plans that will provide them with pathways for universities and future careers. Our counselors and academic team met with the students in grades 8 and 11 and their parents to discuss college planning and career goal setting. These are student-led meetings where students present their plans for university and possible careers to their parents.



University Acceptances and Scholarships

Congratulations to our senior class, who have had incredible success getting accepted into universities in the U.S. and worldwide, along with an abundance of scholarships. Some of these prominent universities include Michigan State University, the University of Massachusetts, the University of Connecticut, Syracuse University, the University of Toronto, the University of British Columbia, and Monash University.

In addition, many of our seniors have been accepted to the top universities in Taiwan, including National Taiwan University (NTU) and National Tsing Hua University (NTHU). Our students also gained acceptance from top universities in Thailand, including Chulalongkorn, Thammasat, and Mahidol. They have also been offered over \$28 million USD in scholarships. We are very proud of them and their achievements.

During the 2024-2025 academic year of TCIS, students have achieved exceptional accomplishments in Chinese.

1. Taiwan Universities Acceptance

We are very proud that this year, the school's admission list in Taiwan is extremely impressive. 7 people were admitted to National Taiwan University, 2 of whom won scholarships; 11 people were admitted to National Tsinghua University, of which 5 were awarded scholarships; 4 were admitted to National Chengchi University; and National Cheng Kung University was admitted 1 person.

7. Chinese Language Teacher Workshops in Thailand

The Thai Chinese International School (TCIS) and the Education Division of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Thailand hosted a Chinese language teacher workshop in Thailand on October 26-27, 2024, at the Thai Chinese Association. Nearly a hundred Chinese language teachers from dozens of public and private schools across Thailand participated in this workshop, making it one of the largest Chinese language professional development events of the year in Thailand. The curriculum for the workshop was planned by Mr. Tony, Head of the Chinese Department at TCIS. The workshop instructors include Adjunct Associate Professor Ms. Vivi from the Department of Chinese Language and Literature Teaching at National Taiwan Normal University, as well as Chinese teachers Mr. Morris and Ms. Vicky from TCIS. During the workshop, these three experts guided and demonstrated the latest skills in Chinese language teaching with the assistance of AI. Their professional and insightful presentations greatly benefited the participating teachers.

7 泰國華語文教師工作坊

This academic year, TCIS students have achieved excellent results in various Chinese language competitions. Additionally, in the Writing competition held by the Republic of China Overseas Chinese Relief Association, we won 2nd place. Furthermore, at the Global Cup Chinese Debate Competition held in Hong Kong, we received the Best Popularity Award. The outstanding performance of our students in these competitions is a testament to TCIS being the best international school for Chinese education in Thailand.

Our Thai Department provides students with enriching experiences tailored to their developmental stages, fostering essential skills while deepening their connection to the Thai language and culture. Throughout the year, our students have excelled in academics, Thai cultural events, and community service.

We actively encourage participation in various competitions on campus and nationally, including the Thai Knowledge Bowl, the National Academic Test Program (NAT), and the Sermpanya Proficiency National Test. Beyond academics, our students make a meaningful impact through initiatives led by the TCIS Red Cross Youth Volunteer Club, Interact Club, and Her Club. These efforts include collaborative projects with Bangplee Nivej Village on Children's Day and donation drives to support those affected by flooding in northern Thailand.
