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he pandemic continued to wreak havoc worldwide and the emergence of new and more contagious variants often caused widespread fear and even panic. However, adversity brings out the best in many people and many institutions as we all battled to provide an education that would meet, challenge, and support this reality. I am grateful to the school community and the School Board, Chaired by Mr. Chang Wei Pien, for sticking by us and supporting us through this continued battle.

The summer of 2021 saw us facing the inevitability of continuing with online education for some time. Being proactive the school delayed the start of the year by a calendar month and the school board continued its support of families through a credit note system for days where instruction was online.

By mid-quarter of the year we were back in class and experimenting with a new delivery system for education that later became known as hybrid, some students in class, others remaining online. This would be the model used for most of the calendar year. Although we encouraged the students to be in class, on-campus, as much as possible, the frequent need to close classes to on-campus learning due to classroom outbreaks, made this a wish rather than a reality.

Resilience is the word I would use to describe our student body. Led by a very strong, respectful and influential group of students, there were many opportunities to celebrate that were not just culturally based. Online coaching by older students of younger ones highlighted the student learning outcome of collaborative workers.

As the year drew to a close we were able to resurrect Spirit Days, Sport Days and activity-based learning. All leading to a much more optimistic and hopeful campus as we entered the final quarter of the year.

#### WASC

he past two or three years have made it very difficult to travel and consequently getting accreditation has become more complicated. With the leadership of Dr. James and Ms. Rung we were able to satisfy the requirements in both Thai and Western Schools. This was our first full accreditation in some time and we received the maximum allowed, a six year accreditation. As a group of independent assessors attested, TCIS is an excellent place for learning.

As is often the case, they identified areas for growth and I am happy to report that we have begun work in the two most important areas: Child Protection and English Language Learners' Program.

- 1. **Child Protection:** This year every staff member took a Child Protection Training Course.
- 2. See in the Report : ELL News. We have dedicated four staff members to this program.

#### English Language Learners (ELLs)

The 2021-2022 school year saw the introduction of a new ELL program at TCIS. The new program is designed to aid English newcomers in transitioning to advanced English instruction at TCIS. Our program is broken down into 3 different tiers of support so that we can better address the variety of our students' needs.

The ELL **Tier 1** program was designed for students who are new to receiving academic content instruction in English and is aimed at increasing their English speaking, listening, and foundational skills rapidly. These classes differ based on age group. Grades 1 and 2 receive daily instruction in needed foundational skills and vocabulary. Grade 3-10 have 80 minutes of classes daily and utilize Cambridge English programs for instructional continuity, as well as hands-on STEM activities to better aid in the development of advanced academic vocabulary.

**Tier 2** is designed to aid students who have a grasp of the English language but need some assistance developing advanced vocabulary skills, increasing their comprehension, and applying English language conventions. For this, students received small-group teacher-led guided reading intervention utilizing Fountas and Pinnell Leveled Literacy Intervention. When the Covid-19 restrictions allow, the ELL groups meet 2 to 3 times a week for 30 to 40 minutes during the mainstream English classes.

Our **Tier 3** ELL program is open to students in grades 7-12 and is for ELL students who possess most of their needed English skills and knowledge but still need some guidance with understanding more complex assignments and grading rubrics. These students receive support with their classwork, formatting support, and assistance with editing their assignments during the daily ELL PLT class.





# Early Years Elementary School

he ES and ECE have had a great year, despite Covid and the constant change from online, to on-campus, to hybrid and back again. Under the Leadership of Dr. James, the structures that were put in place for teacher and student accountability greatly improved the delivery of online instruction. Academic concerns and issues were really no longer a point of contention. A great deal of time was spent with teachers on data-driven decision making. That is,the ability to take the data from assessments and observations and use it in 2 ways: 1. Help students learn how to improve; and 2. Help teachers inform instruction.

The other big area of thanks for Dr. James goes to his organization and support for all those detail areas, such as student dismissal, canteen safety, and other organizational matters. Unfortunately, his time was cut short as he left the school in early March for a Head of Schools position at NIVA, here in Bangkok. We wish him the best!

In early March, Dr. John took over the responsibilities for the ECE/ES school. A focus was given to working on our student learning outcomes of independent learning, Collaborative workers, and complex thinkers as we moved into a time where more group activities such as concerts, assemblies and Activity Days could be celebrated safely. It has been invigorating spending more time in the classrooms and getting to know your children. I will miss this the most as I retire.

This term we also addressed some needs in Technology as new IPADS were purchased for the Grade 3's!







#### NHS

The National Honor Society is an academic organization that recognizes outstanding high school students around the world for their achievements. NHS recognizes students based on its four pillars: Scholarship, Character, Service, and Leadership. This year, NHS inducted eight new members into our TCIS chapter. The selection process this year was extremely challenging due to the many additional restrictions students have faced over the last few school years. Being selected and inducted into the National Honor Society is an outstanding accomplishment for all of them. 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#### **STUDENT COUNCIL 9-12**

If there were a single word to describe the High School Student Council (HSSC) this year it would have to be revolutionary. After consecutive years of struggling against the pandemic, dramatic changes to the SC were necessary in the eyes of the current executive committee members. The first course of action the execoms took was recruiting students for head of department positions prior to the start of the academic year. Later, the HODs and execoms worked hand in hand to gather the most gualified members to fill in five reformed departments that would make up the SC (Event Organizing Department, Media Department, Information and Technology Department, General Communications Department, and Arts and Design Department). With a reinvigorated group of students under new leadership, the SC hosted new events such as a fully digital freshmen orientation, a hybrid-model Chinese karaoke, academic bonding corner day, the Christmas show (a reformed version of the teacher's talent show), an improved Rose and Chocolate day, all high school assemblies, etc. With their new uniforms and greater ambitions, the high school student council of 2021-2022 is certainly one that stands out.

#### **STUDENT COUNCIL 5-8**

Throughout the 2021-2022 school year, the Grade 5-8 Student Council has played an integral role in making TCIS an active and vibrant community for all members to learn and grow. The Student Council's 23 members (including five officers) meet regularly to generate ideas for school activities and improvements, and they put in the work to help make those ideas come to fruition. Much effort goes into planning and facilitating community-building events and celebrations, such as frequent assemblies, the Holiday Door Decoration contest, Spirit Week, and Sports Day. SC members develop and demonstrate important life skills as they communicate with school administrators about the ideas and experiences of their peer group constituents, and collaborate to create solutions and improvements for the TCIS community-making it "fertile ground" for them to work toward their full potential.

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#### ROBOTICS AND TECHNOLOGY In grades 5-8

Secondary school technology courses cover a range of topics from digital literacies to coding and robotics. Lessons are designed to adhere to ISTE Standards and are centered around students successfully achieving learning outcomes. Learning opportunities are presented in ways that are active, connected, and relevant to students, prompting them to become proactive and empowered learners. This year, Grades 5 and 6 students progressed really well with improving their web design, spreadsheets, graphic design and research skills. They were also introduced to computer science concepts, where they explored computer science as a medium for creativity, communication, problem solving, and fun. Coding and Robotics classes revolved around a combination of collaborative learning experiences where organizational, creative & logical thinking skills were used to complete a variety of projects and challenges, giving students the opportunity to explore and make connections to how coding, robotics and artificial intelligence work in real life situations..

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#### UNIVERSITY ACCEPTANCES

This school year at TCIS, our Class of 2022 has gained admission into universities from 12 counties spanning the globe including Thailand, Taiwan, Japan, Hong Kong, the United States, the United Kingdom, Canada, and Australia, among several others. Included in this list are multiple schools ranked in the top 100 worldwide such as the University of Toronto (#16) in Canada, and Monash University (#40) and the University of Queensland (#36) in Australia. Additionally, we have 8 students who were accepted into the #1 ranked school in Taiwan, National Taiwan University. We also have 11 students who were accepted into the #2 university in Thailand, Chulalongkorn University, as well as a student who was accepted into the #1 ranked school in Thailand, Mahidol University. We anticipate many of our seniors getting accepted into more American colleges in the coming weeks.

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#### AP PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

In 2021, TCIS students took a range of AP exams, with 100% of students scoring a 3 or higher in Calculus BC, Biology, Chinese Language and Culture, Japanese Language and Culture, Physics 1: Algebra-Based, Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism, Physics C: Mechanics, and Statistics. Students also took exams in Calculus AB, Chemistry, English Language and Composition, Macroeconomics, Psychology, Research, Statistics, and World History: Modern. In 2022, eight new exams have been added in Comparative Government and Politics, Computer Science A, Drawing, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, Human Geography, Microeconomics, and Seminar, bringing the total number of courses offered to eighteen.

#### COMPUTER CLASS / AP COMPUTER SCIENCE / CODING

This 2021/2022 school year we have added 3-D CAD, Coding and AP Computer Science A to the offerings at TCIS. In 3-D CAD students have worked with a variety of software using Sketchup for Schools, an education version of popular architectural software that students have used to complete projects from big to small, including homes and commercial buildings. In addition we have obtained educational licenses to products from Autodesk which has allowed students to explore projects using programs such as Maya for 3-D rendering and Fusion 360, commonly used in Mechanical Engineering designs and manufacturing. Diversity and choice have played a large role in allowing students to pursue interests in 3-D CAD.

In the Coding class, the focus has been on two areas - Python and Web Development, especially Javascript's role in the web. Using Python students have learned the basics of object oriented programming and have used their knowledge to complete assignments and projects in Data Science, games and other applications. In web development we've explored the design of static web pages using HTML and CSS and then added interactivity using Javascript.

In AP Computer Science A, students are focused on learning programming in Java from print statements to the console, to control structures and iteration, object-oriented programming, algorithms, arrays and arraylists. We are now on the topic of Inheritance with one more unit to go before we prepare for the AP exam on May 4.

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#### ENGLISH LANGUAGE SPEECH CONTEST

Our TCIS Speak Out Speech Competition continues to shine and grow each year. Our English teachers prepare students by teaching them how to write a persuasive speech, and then helping them to prepare to give public speeches. This year, because of Covid restrictions, the speech competition was held in front of other students and judges, and not in front of parents. Last year, we did it virtually and this year was a wonderful leap forward. We look forward to the event returning next year without limitations. Russia

#### MODEL UN

The Model United Nations Club also known as MUN, is where students improve their public speaking skills and global awareness. The MUN brought back the first TCISMUN in a decade. The MUN Club hopes to carry on this tradition throughout the years and open it to all students from international schools all over Thailand. The ultimate goal for TCISMUN is to teach students to think in a critical manner and to be more aware of global issues around the world.

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The Thai Red Cross club is the largest club in the school with 55 members - nine of which are Board members; it continues to strive with compassion and dedication amidst the ongoing pandemic, and they are proud to share their accomplishments and their ongoing programs.

They hosted an online webinar on the topic of protection, gender, and inclusion.

With the support from the Thai Red Cross Youth (ยุวกาชาดไทย), they invited a speaker who specialized in this field from the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC). In addition to the expert's presentation, they incorporated a Mentimeter and Kahoot session to further engage their target audience.

As well as all this, they are developing an informative social media page about social issues in Thailand to raise awareness, empower, and inspire change. Volunteering members are organized into different roles: writer, editor, and designer. Each group is expected to finish at least 1 post in 2 weeks.

Finally, they raised about 5,000 Baht from the SC Holiday Season donations, which is going to be donated to blind children. The Thai Red Cross club has clearly made a great effort in promoting and supporting public health and well-being.

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#### TCIS Young Ambassador

In 2021, TCIS had a welcome opportunity to cooperate with the Participatory Health Region Office (PHR 6) and Thailand's National Health Commission Office (NHCO). Nineteen students from secondary school were selected to be part of the "Young Ambassador" campaign.

The aim of the "Young Ambassadors" campaign is to raise awareness concerning health and wellness since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, and to support health care in our community. TCIS's young ambassadors have participated in various activities which have improved their knowledge and social awareness.

#### Ms. Elizabeth Art Department Annual Report 2021-22

The Visual Arts Department at TCIS is ever growing and evolving. Students are challenged to develop their artistic skills whilst honing their creativity and artistic expression. We focus on Effective Communication through the use of reflections, and further each student's Complex Thinking with authentic cross curricular instruction. Students are exposed to a wide variety of artistic works and media.

#### Hybrid

This year has been a unique challenge for our learners. In order to facilitate the best education possible, art supply kits were made for most classes so that all students were progressing whether they were on campus or at home. For the HS as well as grade 7 and 8, student art kits mirrored what we would normally be doing on campus and students were given the responsibility of self managing a year's worth of art supplies. In Art, taking care of one's supplies is an integral part of our discipline. With hybrid teaching, we made good use of live demonstrations, online tutorials and other websites like Kahoot to keep our learners engaged. As art is about thinking outside of the box, the pandemic created new opportunities to try new lessons, explore home environments for inspiration and try new things in a more interactive way.

#### ES and Art 5 & 6

ES Art purchased portable drafting tables so students could draw with more accurate perspective and comfort. Additionally, banding wheels were purchased so students could create 3D Art with greater ease.



#### **WACOM**

HS Art had several curricular improvements this year. Fourteen WACOM tablets were purchased for Graphic Design and for use in other HS art classes. WACOM tablets are professional touch sensitive tablets with over 8,000 pressure points. The devices are paired with computers and students can mimic the quality of drawing via the screen with use of a digital pen. Additionally, the WACOM tablets will help update the Graphic Design curriculum to Digital Arts as students will be able to essentially paint via computer and better utilize the Adobe software we currently possess. Most importantly, students will be prepared to utilize current design tools should they wish to do so in their further education or personal business endeavors.





#### **Printmaking Press**

HS Art has also purchased a mid-sized lino printing press and created a small printmaking studio on the ground floor. This is an enormous update to the learning of HS students as printmaking is a standard curriculum practice and students will be able to produce age-appropriate creations. Good quality carving tools with replaceable blades have also been acquired, as well as water-based inks, bench hooks, and an air purifier to ensure the safety of students. Currently, a new sink is being installed so students will be fully supervised throughout their creation process. A special thank you to the Board, Dr. John and Dr. Michael for supporting these upgrades so that students can receive the best education possible.

This year, music at TCIS looks a little bit different than in previous years. All of the music teachers and music students played instruments and sang with social distance and strict instrument hygiene protocols. Through it all, we still learned music and we still had fun. #### **Facilities and Safety Protocol**

Although the school has not seen the volume of usage it did in past years, because of the Covid pandemic, maintenance and upgrades still remain a priority. A large investment went into creating a safe learning environment for the students in terms of Covid protocols and in order to prevent outbreaks as much as possible.

There were three major investments in infrastructure and fixed assets at the school this past year. Restroom facilities were upgraded in the elementary and high school buildings, carpet and air conditioning replacement in the 360 theater, and refurbishing middle school lockers were the summer projects. In addition the IMAC lab received a 70% upgrade to the computers with more upgrades scheduled for this year. As well as this, 60 new iPads were purchased to begin the replacement of the older Chromebooks. The Art department also received its long-awaited Printing Press thereby expanding our ability to offer competitive Fine Arts Programs.
