To accomplish this students retrieved the runtimes and release dates of numerous movies over the past few decades. They have arranged their data into both linear inequalities and scatter plots with lines of best fit to try and answer the question.

In the end different groups of students reached different conclusions. Some groups concluded that movie times are increasing and that movies may be as long as 3 hours in the near future. Other groups are not convinced that there is a long term trend and have concluded that movie times might actually decrease in the future.

## Rock Story

- Language Arts and Science Cross-curricular Activity

Understanding a science concept can be challenging and more so if you are learning it in a second language. The first step to understanding is being able to translate the meaning into pictures or stories. In Grade 7 class, we are studying how rocks can be turned into sand. Students use a technique in writing called Storyboard using eight frames to tell a story of a rock that changed by processes such as rockfall, abrasion by water, wind and gravity, plant and animal actions. Storyboard is a wonderful medium for ESL learners because they can use pictures to supplement their sentences.
